Council District 38, which is made up of the
Brooklyn neighborhoods of Sunset Park, Red

Terrace.

Carlos has distinguished himself as a leading voice for working families and immigrant communities across New York City. His strong opposition to the Industry City rezoning was a culmination of the advocacy against luxury development by community residents, business owners, and labor leaders.
