In past years, our annual event in May and the Memorial Day weekend have signaled the end of another busy season and the start of a quiet summer. But not this year. This summer promises to be a very busy time, thanks to the recently redrawn Congressional and State Senate districts, which will require a second primary in August following the one in June.

The redrawing of these districts, and the consequent need for a second primary, has left us angry and dismayed. You can see why right in the title of the article in this newsletter "New Republican-Inspired District Lines Erase Voters' Choices and Threaten the Loss of Progressive Democrats." The first primary, which will be for Governor, Lt. Governor, and Surrogate Court Judge, will still be on June 28. The second primary, for U. S. Congress members and State Senators, will be on August 23. Three Parks will hold a special online endorsement meeting and vote on June 29 for candidates for those offices. Three Parks will also be hosting sidewalk tables on Broadway to promote our endorsed progressive candidates, get out the vote, and help voters understand the issues -- for both the June and August primaries.
