At our October meeting we could truly relish how fortunate we are as residents of the Upper West Side. We met at the Clinton/Kaine Campaign Center and welcomed our Congressman Jerry Nadler, who gave us his outlook for probable election results and what's ahead after the General Election. He said Democrats have realistic hopes for having a majority in the U.S. Senate and possibly winning enough seats in House races to also have a majority there. Donald Trump vs. Three Parks Independent Democrats

If you feel the need to rid yourself of anxiety for our democracy and country in this awful Trump-driven election campaign, and you have not yet been to the Clinton/Kaine Campaign storefront on Broadway and 103 Street sponsored by Three Parks Independent Democrats and Broadway Democrats, you should kick yourself.

Cuomo's Nuclear Bailout?

Governor Cuomo plans to tax New Yorkers at least \$7.6 billion on our electric bills over the next twelve years to bail out old, unsafe and unprofitable nuclear plants located upstate—Entergy-owned FitzPatrick (to be sold to Exelon) and Exelon-owned Ginna and Nine Mile Point. The Public Service Commission announced in August that utility customers in

New York State will pay nearly \$500 million a year in subsidies for the next two years alone to keep the plants operating. http://www.nytimes.com/2016/08/02/nyregion/new-york-state-aiding-nuclear-plants-with-millions-in-subsidies.html

It has been reported that (1) Entergy spent \$1.7 million lobbying New York State in the past two years, (2) Exelon spent \$430,000, including pushing for subsidies, (3) regulators met with Exelon as the administration finalized the subsidy plan, and (4) the nuclear component of the administration's Clean Energy Standard guarantees that "more will be spent to keep nuclear facilities operating than will be spent on solar or wind." http://www.politico.com/ states/new-york/albany/story/2016/07/cuomoadministration-nuclear-proposal-will-costratepayers-billions-103703#ixzz4NuWIh34G and http://www.lohud.com/story/opinion/ contributors/2016/10/12/cuomo-nuclear-plantbailout/91945160/

In other words, this subsidy is just another corporate bailout that, if not stopped in its tracks, could also serve as a contemptible model for other states around the country. Yet the Cuomo administration touts it as creating jobs and clean energy.

If the governor's proposed bailout were really about jobs, then these billions could be better spent ramping up solar and wind power and conservation measures in New York. If the bailout were really about clean energy, then the state would not be encouraging reliance on an industry with a huge carbon footprint given the use of fossil fuels in uranium extraction and transport, not to mention increased rates of cancer and other diseases among Navajo and other indigenous populations on or near whose land much of uranium is mined.


