

Dear Neighbor,

How do we stop the MAGA momentum and beat Trump? Of course, tens of thousands of New Yorkers are going to rallies and marches, but what else can we do? In New York, we have a chance to block Trump by defeating his client, Mayor Eric Adams, and ending that hold on the City.

We can show that Democrats govern better, and make our City a place that will stand and hold its own as Trump destroys communities around the country. For this we need the strongest, most progressive and most experienced elected officials from the Mayor on down.

Three Parks Independent Democrats has emphasized experience in its endorsements for the June Democratic primary.

For Mayor: Brad Lander

Brad went from directing a not-for-profit affordable housing development organization in Brooklyn to Pratt University Center for Community Development. He was elected to the City Council in 2009 and is credited with founding the Progressive Caucus. In 2021, he was elected as the City's Chief Financial Officer, the Comptroller, where his staff of 800 audits the performance and finances of City agencies, reviews City contracts, and manages the City's pension funds. No other candidate has as much hands-on experience and knows how the City actually operates. The one exception is former Comptroller, Scott Stringer. Three Parks urges voters to make Stringer their second choice for Mayor on the ranked choice ballot. Three Parks also urges you not to rank Cuomo at all.

For Comptroller: Mark Levine

Mark taught bilingual math and science in the South Bronx and founded a cooperative credit union serving lower income families in Washington Heights, where he also founded the Barack Obama Democratic Club. In 2013, he was elected to the City Council. As Chair of the Health Committee, he ensured that we had the resources to survive the COVID crisis. He has been Manhattan Borough President for the last three years.

For Public Advocate: Reelect Jumaane Williams

Jumaane has made extensive use of the Public Advocate's power to introduce critical City Council legislation, including bills that protect New Yorkers in the workplace and those looking for work, shield struggling homeowners from undue tax burdens, increase public safety, and fight discrimination in our housing systems.

For Manhattan District Attorney: Reelect Alvin Bragg

Alvin has been a longtime champion for tenants' and workers' rights, and real public safety, in addition to convicting Trump and his organization. Prior to being elected DA in 2021, he served as Chief Deputy Attorney General in New York State and as an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York.

For Manhattan Borough President: Brad Hoylman-Sigal

State Senator since 2012 and Chair of the Judiciary Committee, Brad has passed over 350 bills on housing access and affordability, public safety, LGBTQ+ rights, environmental protection and education. He is a member of the Vote Blue Coalition, supporting Democrats through mobilization efforts.

For City Council: Shaun Abreu

As Chair of the City Council's Committee on Sanitation, Shaun got \$25 million to expand rodent-proof litter baskets. He initiated a trash containerization pilot program and played a pivotal role in restoring \$6.245 million for community composting programs. Prior to his election, Shaun worked for the New York Legal Assistance Group, the National Labor Relations Board, and the Natural Resources Defense Council.

Council Member Gale Brewer has no opposition and is not on the ballot.
