At last night's Committee meeting we asserted that even if 50% of all new 10-A units were rented at affordable rates, 176,000 units would have to be built to compensate for the approximately 88,000 stabilized units that landlords are warehousing. If, as is far more likely, only 25% were affordable, 342,000 would need to be built to compensate for the affordable units being held off the market.
