As this newsletter reaches you, we will be into 2017 and begun implementation of our plans to push back on President-elect Trump's agenda. While all of our candidates were not victorious, we can celebrate the reelections of Senator Chuck Schumer, Representative Jerry Nadler, NYS State Senator Bill Perkins, Assemblyman Danny O'Donnell and extend congratulations to new Congressman Adriano Espaillat and new NYS Senator Marisol Alcantara. Three Parks and Broadway Democrats partnered on the Center to attract and engage hundreds of volunteers and community residents in activities that supported national and state candidates. HOW WE RESIST TRUMP AND HIS EXTREME AGENDA

Donald Trump doesn't deserve the benefit of the doubt because he has not earned the benefit of the doubt. The burden is on Trump to change his stripes, though I, like many of you, am deeply doubtful that will ever happen. As such, there can be no normalization of him or his Administration.

Here are some ideas:

Write letters to media editors every time you see an article or broadcast that utilizes a normalizing tone or doesn't make note of the extreme nature of Trump, his behavior and rhetoric, or his Administration's actions.

Use the hashtag #NotNormal or #DontNormalize on your social media platforms.

Contact your elected officials via petitions, letters, calls and social media to urge them to resist any action that would normalize the Administration and demand that they loudly condemn any Trump actions that are unbefitting our democracy.

Reach out to your friends and family and encourage them to do the same.

Support rhetorically and financially those organizations that are stepping up to fight normalization.

Advocacy groups and everyday citizens must become a unified blocking force for Congressional Democrats who are fighting against Trump's extreme agenda.

Congressional Democrats must ... use all available means to resist and thwart Trump's agenda. But we need a tough and efficient fighting force standing behind us. Concerned national organizations and individuals must band together immediately, in unprecedented and streamlined ways, putting aside slight ideological differences and competitions, and become committed to sharing resources in the interest of building an all-in force. It may very well require unorthodox advocacy strategies, like the creation of broader-than-normal coalitions based on each of Trump's individual proposals, wherein single issue groups may find themselves working on issues outside their normal wheelhouse to the extent their memberships allow, for the greater good.

Looking Back at 2016: Some Thoughts

In February, Bernie Sanders teams in New York wound up submitting more than 80,000 ballot petitions to the NYS Board of Elections or 16 times the required 5,000. Not surprisingly many Three Parks members contributed in this effort to move our donkey party in a direction of victory for a people's agenda.
